Special risk insurance for our conference is included in the registration fee. This insurance **supplements** your personal insurance in the event of an accident or illness in our meetings, including reasonable travel time. If a person has Medicare insurance, Medicare is the primary insurance, and our insurance is supplementary.

The insurance is in effect from 12:00 PM before and until 12:00 PM after the TEEA State Conference. Injury or illness must be treated by a doctor or hospital while you are at the TEEA State Conference, **not when you get home**. Only accidents or illnesses that occur as you travel home or continuing treatment may be submitted later. Coverage does not extend to personal loss such as eye glasses, dentures, etc. **Inform the TEEA State Treasurer immediately** in case of accident or illness. The claimant must obtain a claim form from the TEEA State Treasurer, which includes the policy number and serial number. The claimant must follow the instructions on the claim form, and return this form directly to the insurance company.
